



Case Submission Guidelines

1. A case submission must include a case report and a PowerPoint presentation. The case report must be limited to 500 words (not including headers) and must contain the following sections: Title, Introduction, Clinical Case, and Discussion.
2. Please identify a category for your case submission. You may only choose one category. Please choose the category, based upon the most important learning point from your case. Case categories include:
 1. Myocardial Infarction & Shock
 2. Heart Failure Shock
 3. Post-cardiotomy Shock
 4. RV & PE-Shock
 5. Valvular-Shock
 6. Miscellaneous Shock
 7. Access & Complications
 8. Hemodynamics
 9. Teams (Coordination/EMS/Admin)
 10. ICU Care & Pharmacology
3. The SCAI Program Committee endorses the position of the American Association for the Advancement for Science (AAAS) in requiring assurances of the responsible use of animals in research. All submissions for consideration must follow these guidelines.
4. Each presenting author must comply with the SCAI Disclosure Policy and must provide the following: indication of the relationship, the associated commercial entity, and the level of support.
5. There is no limit on the number of authors for case submissions.
6. All revisions must be made by the case submission deadline.
7. The submitter acts on behalf of all co-authors and in submitting a case, transfers to SCAI the copyright and all other rights in the material comprising the application if the application is accepted. Co-authors reserve the following:
 - All proprietary rights other than copyright, such as patent rights
 - The right to use all or part of the application in future works of their own. SCAI, as holder of the copyright on the accepted application, reserves all rights of reproduction, distribution, performance, display, and the right to create derivative works in both print and digital formats.
8. Case acceptance notifications will be emailed to the addresses provided for the presenting authors, along with presentation guidelines.
9. Requests to withdraw a case must be submitted in writing to cases@scai.org by **September 1, 2024**.
